SAGA – COLLINGWOOD’S LIGHTHOUSE GATEWAY
By Artist Pierre Poussin, funded by the Government of Canada
Corner of First and Hurontario Streets

“Saga” is a tribute to Collingwood’s rich shipbuilding heritage situated in the town’s Heritage Conservation District. The installation honours the historic Nottawasaga Lighthouse and aims to immortalize the first and last vessels built in Collingwood’s harbour.

On the east corner, “The Nahma”, built by W. Watts & Sons represents the sail powered, fishing skiffs popular on the Great Lakes from the 1850s onwards.

On the west corner, built for the Canadian Coast Guard, the “Sir Wilfrid Laurier”, was the last steel ship launched at the Collingwood Shipyards in 1985.



DARE TO DREAM
by artist W.W. Hung – Commissioned by the Town of Collingwood to represent and celebrate the LGBTQ2S+ community
Tremont Square

This dynamic installation features the cast of a hand-sculpted rhinoceros perched on top of a seven and a half foot tall, stainless-steel arc. The rhinoceros, a symbol representing the LGBTQ2S+ community first used in 1974, is poised on its hind legs as if about to take flight with the help of eight painted aluminum balloons attached to its back. The bowed shape of the stainless-steel arc underneath the cast rhino suggests the curve of a rainbow while the balloons “lifting” up the rhinoceros are brightly adorned in the colours of the original rainbow Pride flag from 1978.

Five paintings combine to show the development of Collingwood – from the first inhabitants of the nearby escarpment, the Petun Indians, to the construction of the grain depot and finally recreation on the water today.

Mural artist Blaze Wiradharma has created iconic Collingwood imagery, grounded in his personal journey of growth in our community, reflecting his experience growing up and living in Collingwood throughout different stages of life. This concept is relatable on many levels to viewers who have visited or grown up in Collingwood. Imagery related to Collingwood and the surrounding area and other forms of wildlife make up this visual journey through growth.



SKI TRAIN

86 Hurontario Street

Individually sculpted and kiln-fired clay pieces depict the 1950’s “ski train” arriving at the Craigleith Station baring passengers bound for the ski hills.

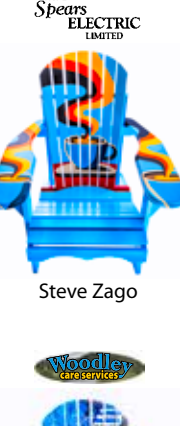
